INAUGURATION OF NEW TENNIS COURTS

On April 26, 2022, Council voted to award the contract for the construction of new tennis courts construction to Les Pavages Théoret for \$297,535 plus taxes.

The new tennis courts, which will be made of a rigid surface covered by layers of acrylic, will be a significant improvement to the current Senneville Park facilities. They will also include markings for pickleball games.

The new courts will be inaugurated on June 17, 2022.

STORE YOUR NONMOTORIZED WATERCRAFT AT "THE 53"

A municipal service for the storage of your nonmotorized watercraft is available again this year.

A portion of the building located at 53 Senneville Road (formerly designed as a water treatment plant) now houses a secure storage area for watercraft such as kayaks and paddleboards.

This municipal facility with chip access allows you to store personal equipment on a first-come, first-served basis.

- \$50 Off-season storage

QUIET SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS

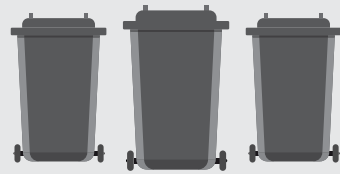

COLLECTIONS



Garbage is picked up weekly on **THURSDAYS** starting at **7 A.M.**



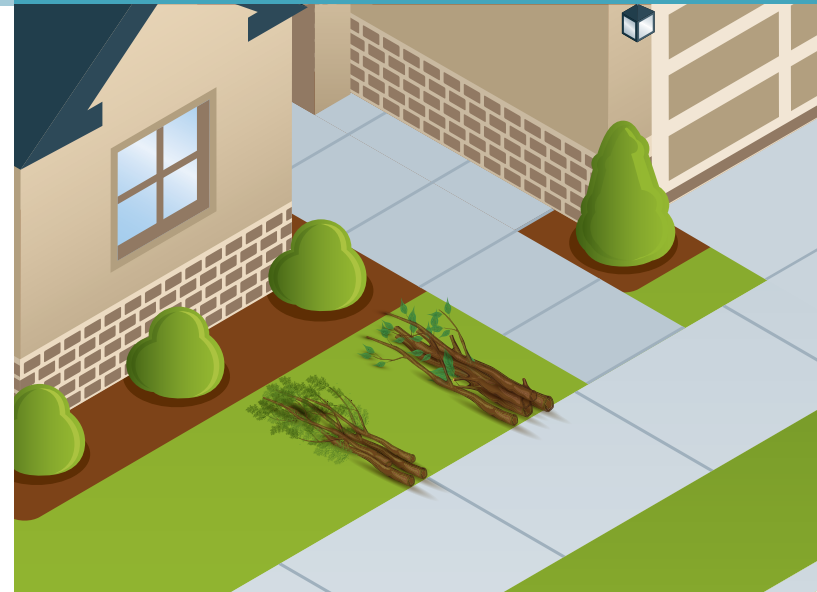
Composting pick-up is on **MONDAYS** starting at **7 A.M.**; containers can be placed at the end of your driveway as of 6 p.m. the night before.



Recycling pick-up is on **MONDAYS** starting at **7 A.M.**; containers can be placed at the end of your driveway as of 6 p.m. the night before.



Bulk waste pick-ups are **FOUR TIMES PER YEAR.** For 2022, the dates are: **May 20, July 8 and September 9.**



BRANCH COLLECTION

The Village of Senneville makes special collections for branches. These branches are shredded and ground into chips. The chips are available free of charge to the citizens of Senneville. Branch collection will take place **every second Tuesday from mid-April to mid-November** (weather permitting). The remaining dates this year are:

TREE FELLING AND PLANTING

If you wish to cut down a tree on your property, you must obtain a certificate of authorization from the Village of Senneville. Authorization is only granted under specific circumstances and if space allows, you must plant another tree in its place, as prescribed by our tree planting program.

To obtain a certificate, please email info@villagesenneville.qc.ca. There are also strict guidelines around pruning and trimming trees on private property, and certificates of authorization are required for this undertaking as well.

Please remember that felling, trimming, pruning and the use of leaf blowers can cause noise that is unpleasant for your neighbours. Please pay attention to noise levels and dispose of your cut branches properly. For more information, see [By-law 482, article 6.1](#).



MIGRATORY BIRDS

Your property may be located in Senneville's migratory bird sanctuary, identified in the [1994 Migratory Birds Convention Act](#) and the regulations associated with it.

If you plan on undertaking work on your property, it must be carried out without disrupting, harming or destroying migratory birds and their nests. The critical periods are nesting, breeding and migration. For these same reasons, it is forbidden to let a dog or cat circulate freely in a migratory bird sanctuary.

CONSTRUCTION AND PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS

Are you planning construction on your property or making some home improvements this year? Any such undertaking requires a permit. Make sure you have all the necessary documents before submitting your request for a permit.

For your request to be processed, it must be properly completed and include all the required documents including metric scale plans.

To submit a permit request, you can send it to info@villagesenneville.qc.ca or you can make an appointment to come to the Town Hall in person by calling 514 457-6020.

OUTDOOR FIRES

Please remember that in the Village of Senneville, outdoor fires are prohibited. These include bonfires, campfires, yard waste or tree-trimming burn piles, trash fires, burning construction material, fire baskets, and fireplaces and woodstoves, even if equipped with a fire screen.

Under certain circumstances, a permit can be obtained from the Montreal fire department (Service de sécurité incendie de Montréal) or the Montreal environment department (Direction de l'environnement).

SENNEVILLE, AN ENDEMIC ZONE FOR LYME DISEASE

According to the Institut national de santé publique, the risk of contracting Lyme Disease, transmitted by the Ixodes scapularis or black-legged tick or deer tick, has increased in some municipalities. In 2021, the Village of Senneville was included in the list of endemic zones.

THE EMERALD ASH BORER

The emerald ash borer is present throughout the Senneville territory. Each year, the municipality updates the inventory of public trees at the end of their life, such as ash trees affected by the emerald ash borer, in order to establish the planning of the necessary arboricultural work.

Please be aware of the health of ash trees on your property. Should you notice ash trees with compromised health on your own or on public property, please fill out an [online request](#).

WATCH FOR THE EUROPEAN SPONGY MOTH

The European spongy moth (formerly known as the European gypsy moth) has been observed in western Monterégie in the past as well as in Senneville.

REDUCING THE NUMBER OF MOSQUITOES IN YOUR ENVIRONMENT

It is possible to reduce the number of mosquitoes in your environment by adopting certain measures. One way is eliminating stagnant water, which is an ideal breeding ground for mosquitoes that can carry the West Nile virus.

You can eliminate stagnant water by removing the water that accumulates in swales, gutters, solar cloth, old tires or any other outdoor object that may contain water.

A NEW PLAN CONCERNING FLOODZONES, SHORELINES AND LITTORAL ZONES

On March 1, 2022, the Quebec government implemented a new transitional plan for the management of flood zones, shorelines and littoral zones. This plan is based on the [regulations](#) (in French only) concerning the transitional implementation of changes in flood risk management.

New regulatory provisions identify the activities (works, construction or other interventions) carried out on the shoreline, littoral and flood-prone areas that require authorization from the municipality.

These provisions also provide for:

- The terms and conditions applicable to these municipal authorizations;
- The accountability requirements applicable to municipalities; and
- Penalties.

YOUR PETS! DON'T FORGET THE RULES!

Should you get a dog, please register your new family member with the Village of Senneville within 30 days. It’s easy! Just drop by the Town Hall and complete the registration. It’s a free service and you’ll get a tag to put on your dog’s collar.

Please provide a certificate signed by a veterinarian proving that your dog has been vaccinated against rabies.

And please remember that there is “pet etiquette” in the Village. You can always consult the by-law concerning pets ([No. 394](#)) or you can check our website for [a brief summary](#).

MUNICIPAL TAXES

Municipal tax installments are always due annually on two dates. This year, the first installment was due on **February 25, 2022** and the second one is due on **May 26, 2022**.

There is a **\$50 administration fee** for any payment refused by the bank (such as an NSF cheque). While there is no longer a penalty charged on arrears, all arrears bear interest at the new rate of 10% per year, calculated daily from the due date.

PAYMENT METHODS

There are several convenient ways to pay your municipal taxes.

BY MAIL:

You can send post-dated cheques payable to the Village of Senneville using the payment stubs attached to your tax account.

IN PERSON AT THE TOWN HALL:

You can deliver your cheque(s) in person. You can also pay on site with your debit card or in cash. Finally, you can also use the mail chute on the exterior wall of Town Hall (near the municipal garage) to drop your cheques.

We do not accept credit card payments.

AT YOUR FINANCIAL INSTITUTION:

You can pay at the counter or the ATM of your financial institution with detachable payment coupons.

ONLINE THROUGH FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS:

You can pay your taxes online with the following institutions: Caisse Desjardins, CIBC, BMO, TD Canada Trust, Scotiabank and National Bank.

When paying on the financial institution's website, please note that you must enter the client number that appears on the tax account. Some financial institutions require a four (4) digit number, so you will need to add one or in some cases two zeros (0) before your account number. For example, for client number 50 = 0050, or 150 = 0150.

To avoid interest charges, please allow two working days before the due date for this payment to be sent to the Village of Senneville.
