



### **MORGAN ARBORETUM**

### QUIET SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS

Please think of your neighbours on Sundays and holidays if you are doing anything that might disturb their comfort, rest or well-being, especially from Monday to Friday between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m.; on Saturdays before 8 a.m. and after 6 p.m.; and on Sundays or during a legal or statutory holiday.

And thank you for your consideration during the summer months when windows are open and residents are enjoying the outdoors.

### YOUR PETS! DON'T FORGET THE RULES!

Should you get a dog, please register your new family member with the Village of Senneville within 30 days. It's easy! Just drop by the Town Hall and complete the registration. It's a free service and you'll get a tag to put on your dog's collar. Please provide a certificate signed by a veterinarian proving that your dog has been inoculated against rabies.

### **A REMINDER** ABOUT SNOW REMOVAL. WINTER PARKING AND RECYCLING BINS

While the Public Works team is in charge of snow removal in the parking lots of our municipal installations as well as along the municipal walkways throughout the Village, an external supplier takes care of snow removal in our streets and of spreading salt and other abrasives.

During the winter, please remember that the rules for street parking are different:

- It is prohibited to park your vehicles on the street at night between 12 (midnight) and 7 a.m.
- In addition, you are not permitted to park on the street for more than four (4) consecutive hours between 7 a.m. and 12 (midnight).
- Finally, please be aware that the plow trucks try to avoid recycling, composting and garbage bins, but roads must always be cleaned, even on collection days. If possible, place your bins at the end of your driveway and not on the road.



### **COLLECTION**



Composting pick-up is on **MONDAYS** starting at **7 A.M.**; containers can be placed at the end of your driveway as of 6 p.m. the night before.

Recycling pick-up is on **MONDAYS** starting at **7 A.M.**; containers can be placed at the end of your driveway as of 6 p.m. the night before.

Bulk waste pick-ups are FOUR TIMES PER YEAR. For 2022, the dates are: January 14, May 20, July 8 and September 9.

### RECYCLING OF BATTERIES AND INK CARTRIDGES

You can drop off your used batteries and ink cartridges for recycling at the Town Hall during opening hours:


Monday to Thursday from 8 a.m. to noon and from 12:45 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., and on Fridays from 8 a.m. to noon.

### MASK DISPOSAL

To deal with the issue of procedure mask waste caused by COVID-19, the Village of Senneville has acquired containers that can collect soiled masks without polluting. You can drop your used masks at the Town Hall, the municipal garage or the community centre.

### **BRANCHES AND WOOD CHIPS**

In keeping with the municipality's philosophy of avoiding landfill, the Village of Senneville makes special collections for branches. These branches are shredded and ground into chips. The chips are available free of charge to the citizens of Senneville.

For 2022, the official branch collection will take place every second Tuesday from mid-April to **mid-November** (weather permitting):

### **SPRING FLOODS**

Flooding is common in the springtime. Please be aware of whether you are in a floodzone. **As of March 1**, the flow or flood level requires special monitoring so please pay close attention.

### FLUSHING THE AQUEDUCT NETWORK

In May and September and/or October, the Public Works department flushes the aqueduct network and inspects the fire hydrants. This is usually done during Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Flushing consists of evacuating the particles and fragments on the inside walls of the aqueduct network pipes. Afterwards, we evacuate the soiled water through the fire hydrants.

This process can cause a change in water pressure and/or may produce a reddish (rusty) colour. We strongly suggest you avoid washing clothes or dishes during these flushing periods.

If your water is rusty, turn on the cold water tap of your bathtub and let it run approximately 15 minutes or until clear.

### CHARGING STATIONS FOR ELECTRIC VEHICLES

Visitors to the Town Hall are welcome to use the two free charging stations located in our parking lot.

In addition, there are two pay charging stations located at 20 Morningside Avenue. With a FLO membership, you'll pay \$1/hour.

### PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS IN SENNEVILLE

Do you know what your options are for public transportation in the Village of Senneville? Below you will find an outline of the main options.

#### STM BUS

Senneville residents can access various STM buses at the Sainte-Anne-de- Bellevue/Macdonald Bus Station located on Sainte-Anne Street, facing the McDonald Campus or at various bus stops throughout Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue.

#### TAXIBUS: SHARED TAXI SERVICE IN SENNEVILLE

To reserve a seat on the shared taxi service, please call **514 636-6666**.

From any designated taxibus stop, you can travel to:

- The Macdonald terminus (for the 200, 211 and 212 bus lines, and the 405 and 411 Express lines);
- Senneville Town Hall (Senneville/Morningside);
- The commuter train station in Sainte-Anne-de Bellevue; or
- The terminus stop for the 68 Pierrefonds terminus stop at the corner of Cap-Saint-Jacques/Gouin.

You can also travel back from these locations to your local taxibus stop. Departure times now allow users taking the latest downtown trains to use the shared taxi to get home.

### HOW DOES THE SHARED TAXI SERVICE WORK?

The Senneville shared taxi service operates from Monday to Sunday, except on legal holidays.

### HOW CAN I USE THE SERVICE?

- You can now <u>make a reservation online</u> (in French).
- You must reserve your trip prior to each use by calling **514 636-6666**.
- From April 1 to November 30, you must reserve at least 40 minutes prior to your trip.
- From December 1 to March 31, you must reserve at least 60 minutes prior to your trip.

### HOW MUCH DOES THE SERVICE COST?

**Fares** for Transport adapté and other taxi services apply. Monthly TRAM passes valid within the appropriate fare zone are also accepted. Cash payment is not accepted.

For customers transferring to an STM bus or metro: You can pay your fare directly at the transfer point, where <u>bus and metro fares</u> apply. Customers are invited to validate their fare card or pay in cash at the transfer point.

For customers transferring to an EXO commuter train: TRAM passes for the appropriate fare zone can be used and you are invited to validate your fare card at the train station. TRAIN fare cards (monthly, unit or tickets) cannot be used to pay for a shared taxibus ride. Fare payment in cash or with EXO TRAIN passes are not accepted aboard taxis.

### TREES

Residents must obtain a certificate of authorization to cut down a tree on their property. Authorization is only granted under very specific conditions and any tree cut down must be replaced if space allows.

To obtain a certificate, please send your application form to **info@villagesenneville.qc.ca**.

Tree pruning and trimming on private property requires a certificate of authorization and must be performed by a recognized arborist registered with the municipality of Senneville.

A pruning or felling certificate costs \$25 and is valid for three months. The certificate can be extended beyond three months for an additional \$12.50.

### **MIGRATORY BIRDS**

Your property may be located in Senneville's migratory bird sanctuary, identified in the 1994 Migratory Birds Convention Act and the regulations associated with it.

If you plan on undertaking work on your property, it must be carried out without disrupting, harming or destroying migratory birds and their nests.

The critical periods are nesting, breeding and migration. For these same reasons, it is forbidden to let a dog or cat circulate freely in a migratory bird sanctuary.

### CONSTRUCTION AND PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS

Are you planning construction on your property or making some home improvements this year? Any such undertaking requires a permit. Make sure you have all the necessary documents before submitting your request for a permit. For your request to be processed, it must be properly completed and include all the required documents including metric scale plans.

To submit a permit request, you can send it to info@villagesenneville.qc.ca or you can make an appointment to come to the Town Hall in person by calling 514 457-6020.

# BASEMENT PUMP

For residents in the new Senneville-sur-le-parc development, in the coming months, the Village of Senneville inspector may be required to inspect your basement pump.

The purpose of this inspection is to ensure that none of the pumps are connected to the Village of Senneville sewer system. Public Works will set up an appointment with you to make this inspection.

### FINANCE

### **MUNICIPAL TAXES**

Municipal tax installments are always due annually on two dates. This year, the first installment was due on **February 25, 2022** and the second one is due on **May 26, 2022**.

There is a **\$50 administration fee** for any payment refused by the bank (such as an NSF cheque). While there is no longer a penalty charged on arrears, all arrears bear interest at the new rate of 10% per year, calculated daily from the due date.

#### PAYMENT METHODS

There are several convenient ways to pay your municipal taxes.

#### **BY MAIL:**

You can send post-dated cheques payable to the Village of Senneville using the payment stubs attached to your tax account.

#### IN PERSON AT THE TOWN HALL:

You can deliver your cheque(s) in person. You can also pay on site with your debit card or in cash. Finally, you can also use the mail chute on the exterior wall of Town Hall (near the municipal garage) to drop your cheques.

We do not accept credit card payments.

#### AT YOUR FINANCIAL INSTITUTION:

You can pay at the counter or the ATM of your financial institution with detachable payment coupons.

#### **ONLINE THROUGH FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS:**

You can pay your taxes online with the following institutions: Caisse Desjardins, CIBC, BMO, TD Canada Trust, Scotiabank and National Bank.

When paying on the financial institution's website, please note that you must enter the client number that appears on the tax account. Some financial institutions require a four (4) digit number, so you will need to add one or in some cases two zeros (0) before your account number. For example, for client number 50 = 0050, or 150 = 0150.

To avoid interest charges, please allow two working days before the due date for this payment to be sent to the Village of Senneville.
