





INFO-COUNCIL

Following each monthly Council meeting, the Mayor provides a summary of the topics discussed and adds information on various relevant subjects.



EMERGENCY MEASURES AND CODERED

In the event of major unforeseen issues (such as bad weather, a boil advisory, a major gas leak, etc.) that could affect citizens, we send out a newsletter with the banner "Emergency Measures."

We typically use this newsletter when there is flooding in the municipality. CODERed is an additional method of notifying registered citizens of emergency measures by SMS, email or phone.



PUBLIC NOTICES

These notices are used to communicate the adoption of by-laws, draft by-laws and public meetings (minor derogations, public consultations, referendums, and the tabling of financial reports and budget forecasts).



ROAD AND MAINTENANCE WORKS

This newsletter is sent out when there is a breakdown or obstruction or when maintenance work takes place on Senneville territory.

This social media platform is an effective means of communication to connect with the community and to share certain reminders. It is a complement to the municipality's tools and website (the official information reference).








ONLINE REQUEST FORM

Our "Online Request" system is an interactive platform that allows you to send your requests and comments directly to the municipality's administration via our website.

With the creation of each request, a unique number is automatically generated, allowing you to track the status of your request online and ensure its follow-up. The Village Administration will have regular reminders for you about living well in Senneville. Generally these reminders will be grouped based on season. Our website provides more detail on each area should you wish go into more in depth on a given topic.



BOOKS AND MUCH MUCH MORE!

Just a reminder that the municipality has an agreement with the City of Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue allowing Senneville residents to enjoy all services offered by its library. You do not need to pay for the registration as it is billed directly to the Village of Senneville. For an overview of library services, please check our website.

FALL REMINDER: CHECK YOUR SMOKE DETECTORS WHEN YOU SET BACK YOUR CLOCKS

This year, when we turn our clocks back to local standard time during the night of November 6 to November 7, the Service de sécurité incendie de Montréal (SIM) suggests that you use this occasion to check that your smoke detectors are in good working order.

It is a simple action that can save lives. Too often, lives are lost because smoke detectors are not working properly or not installed at all. Let's protect ourselves and our families using this inexpensive way to warn occupants of a fire.

Checking your smoke detector monthly is best. All you have to do is press the test button for a few seconds until you hear the alarm. If your smoke alarm is linked to an alarm company, remember to inform them that you will be testing your system. TREES AND VEGETATION

TREE DIAMETER AND HEIGHT **REQUIREMENTS**

There has been an amendment to the zoning by-law regarding the size of trees residents can plant:

Deciduous trees: 4 cm in diameter measured at 0.3 cm from the ground at planting. Coniferous trees: must reach 5 m at maturity.

ECOTERRITORY DETAILS

Please note that if you are undertaking replanting on the ecoterritory, a directory of recommended trees is available for consultation. Please contact the Town Hall.

APPLICATIONS FOR TREE-CUTTING PERMITS


Please remember that if you would like to apply to have a tree cut down, you must submit an arborist's report with your application for a permit. Permits cost \$100.

TREE REPLACEMENT • REMINDER

If you want to replace a tree, you can obtain financial support from the municipality of up to \$500 per property per year, as set out in the modification to By-law 485 this past May. For more information, check our website.

REMINDER • DOG LICENCES

In Senneville, dog tags are required. These tags are free and available at the Town Hall. For more information, please see the section on our website about pets.


A LOOK BACK AT 2022

The Senneville Technical Services/Public Works team has had a busy year so far, with some significant accomplishments. First, the village tennis courts were entirely reconstructed to ensure years of enjoyment for our residents.

In addition, a major rehabilitation of the Rivière à l'Orme Bridge was undertaken, as well as pavement rehabilitation on Tunstall Avenue and Aberge Avenue and other paving repairs throughout the territory.

BRANCH COLLECTION

Branch collection will continue on Tuesdays every two weeks until mid-November (weather permitting). You can check <u>our website</u> for the schedule.





HOW SHOULD YOU PLACE YOUR BIN?

The municipality would like to remind you that, on garbage collection days, it is very important to place your roll-out container on your property (not in the street) to facilitate snow removal and eliminate the risk of breakage.

Your bin is broken or hasn't been emptied? Submit a request via <u>our interactive platform</u>.

CAN LEAVES BE PICKED UP WITH GREEN WASTE COLLECTION?

Leaves are collected with organic matter during the green waste collection and can be placed in paper bags, cardboard boxes or in a rigid container. As of October 14, paper bags will be made available to citizens at the Town Hall. A few bags will be available per address; quantities are limited. For more information, please consult our website.

BULK WASTE COLLECTION

Bulk waste collection happens four times per year. The next collection will be at the beginning of January 2023. For the schedule, please check our website.

Until then, you can always bring your bulk items to one of **Montreal's ecocentres**.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Neighborhood Watch is dedicated to maintaining a sense of safety in our neighborhood.

ANIMAL SERVICES

The municipality has an agreement with the Centre Canin du Suroît/Contrôle animal Vaudreuil-Soulanges. To report an aggressive, lost, captured, injured, mistreated or dead animal at any time, call 450 510-1508.

The Municipality ensures the safety of its citizens and their animals on its territory through an animal controller. Contrôle animal Vaudreuil-Soulanges has the authority to intervene on behalf of the Municipality to recover or capture stray, injured or dead animals. WILDLIFE AND DRIVERS

We would like to remind motorists to drive slowly on roadways throughout the municipality to protect the variety of wildlife that can be seen crossing our streets. Reducing your speed will help save some of our wildlife. Seasonally, turtles cross our roads to nest. We also often see squirrels, chipmunks, groundhogs and raccoons on our streets.

Please drive prudently.

WINTER MAINTENANCE

Remember that there are a few rules to follow in the wintertime to ensure that our streets are safely cleaned and maintained. Please keep these behaviours in mind:

- Do not push or throw your snow on the streets.
- Do not park your vehicles on the street at night between midnight and 7 a.m.
- Avoid parking your vehicles on the street for more than four (4) consecutive hours during the day or at night between 7 a.m. and midnight.

TREE PLANTING

In mid-October, Senneville will plant 240 trees with the <u>GRAME organization</u>. The plantings will be carried out throughout the territory, in all parks and along the streets.

PROPERTY EVALUATION REFORM


The most recent property evaluation reform, tabled by the *Direction du Service de l'évaluation foncière de la Ville de Montréal* on September 14, is the basis for setting municipal taxes for the years 2023, 2024 and 2025.

Each assessment reflects what was deemed to be the fair value of residential or commercial property, based on market conditions as of July 1, 2021. The average change for all cities in the metropolitan area is approximately 32.4%.

The Village of Senneville's overall housing values have increased by 45.9% since the last evaluation reform. Thus, the average price of a single-family residence has risen from \$888,763 to \$1,489,700.

However, an increase in the value of your property does not automatically translate into an equivalent increase in your municipal tax bill. In fact, the Village of Senneville adjusts rates to reflect changes in values. The tax rates are set annually in the municipal budget to obtain the expected revenues to provide the services of the municipality.

If you have done renovations or undertaken construction, it is possible that your assessment will be higher. The amount of your taxes and the property value may also be influenced by being in a very popular real estate sector where selling prices tend to increase.
